Interaction with Caregiver:

Get specific information from foster parent about the child's daily life and about the child's behavior related to:

Child's daily functioning

- · Behavior: problems and strengths
- Details of children's services and any barriers to participation
- Contacts made by parent through letters, phone calls, etc.
- Child's adjustment to separation and loss Activities, extracurriculars
- · Child's sleeping habits
- · Child's eating habits
- thow does the child behave around pets?
- Child's interactions with other household members

- Child's school performance and attitude toward school
- · Adjustments in school
- Does the caregiver report any concerns or outstanding needs?
- Do caregivers work? Is after school care required? What are the details? Daycare?
- Caregiver's views on permanency (at the appropriate time later in the case)



Educational Advocacy

When children come into foster care they lose about 3 months worth of education for each foster home move they make. They have to get used to a new family, new school, and new friends. A CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) volunteer role is crucial supporting children, especially when it comes to their education. Children With Individualized Education Plans (IEPS) or 504 plans require special attention to ensure they receive the necessary accommodations and services in school. Tutoring can be a valuable resource for these children, providing them with the extra help they need to succeed academically. Advocating for educational rights involves working closely with school staff, attending meetings, and ensuring that the child's needs are being met according to their IEP or 504 plan. The dedication of an advocate can make a significant difference in the educational outcomes for these children, helping them to achieve their full potential.




